Designation	Protection?	Tax Benefit?	Application Oversight?
National Register of Historic Places	No, unless federal funds used or a federal permit required.	Income-producing property owned by a tax-paying entity listed in the National Register may qualify for the <b>Federal Rehab tax credit</b> for substantial rehabs.	Michigan SHPO administers applications in Michigan on behalf of the National Park Service.
State Historical Marker	No. However, adherence to the Secretary of the Interior's Standards recommended.	No.	Michigan History Center.
Local Historic District	Yes, managed change administered by the local Historic District Commission.	No.	Local government, Michigan SHPO provides guidelines and guidance for survey.
