Designation	Protection?	Tax Benefit?	Application Oversight?
<b>National Register of Historic Places</b>	No, unless federal funds used or a federal permit required.	Income-producing property owned by a tax-paying entity listed in the National Register may qualify for the <b>Federal Rehab tax credit</b> for substantial rehabs.	Michigan SHPO administers applications in Michigan on behalf of the National Park Service.
<b>State Historical Marker</b>	No. However, adherence to the Secretary of the Interior's Standards recommended.	No.	Michigan History Center.
<b>Local Historic District</b>	Yes, managed change administered by the local Historic District Commission.	No.	Local government, Michigan SHPO provides guidelines and guidance for survey.
