"Historic Preservation as a Key Ingredient of Michigan Place-Making"

As Chief Executive Officer of the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC), and as President and Chair of the Michigan Strategic Fund, Quentin L. Messer, Jr. has very full days. He implements MEDC's core mission of fostering business development, providing access to capital, and enhancing Michigan's image. He sees all he does as building a strong and equitable economy for all Michiganders, a goal enhanced by elevating small business, recognizing the state's distinctive regions, and assuring community development based on place-making.

Mr. Messer comes to place-making as an economic development professional who sees historic preservation as a versatile economic tool. It is not lost on him that keeping older buildings in use helps meet the state's need for housing at all pricepoints, keeps downtown retail alive, builds walkable living and working environments that thrive as more people work remotely in both small communities and large cities, and, along the way, crafts unique spaces that are highly marketable.
